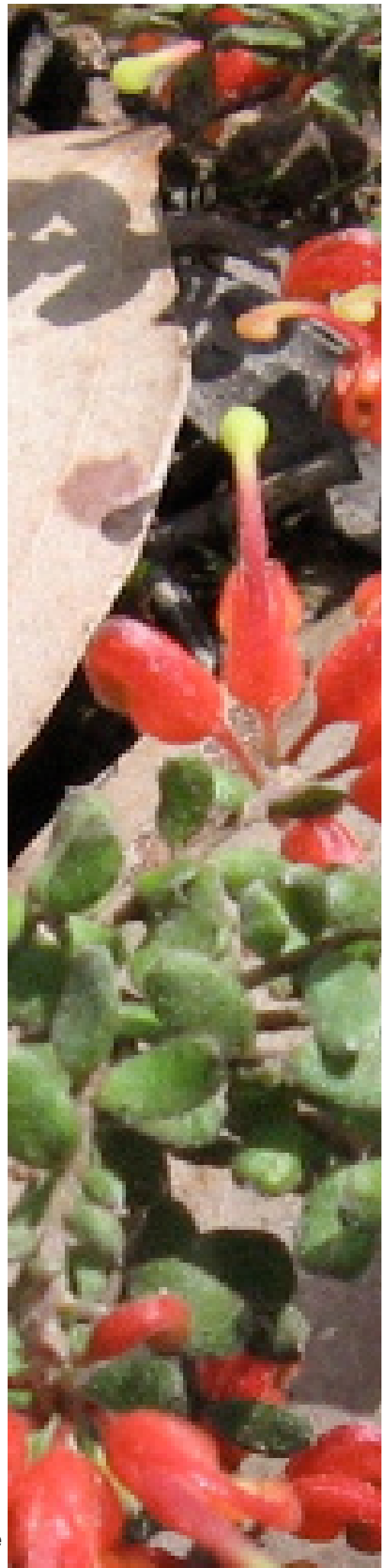
### **20th Birthday celebrations at the Lower Shelter Sunday November 13th 2011**
